Course Orientation June 22, 2015

Course Goals

- Provide students with experience providing primary and some specialty care in a free community clinic serving the diverse uninsured population of Miami-Dade County
- Enhance the clinical and patient management skills of students
- Learn to navigate the complex and limited "system" of care available to uninsured patients
- Learn about the social determinants of health and disease
- Develop skills as a team leader, educator, and mentor

Course Requirements

- Volunteer at a minimum of 18 clinic sessions
 - $(\geq 9 \text{ sessions during the third year})$ at the following clinics:
 - San Juan Bosco Clinic on Tuesday nights
 - Lotus Wellness Center on Monday nights
- May replace up to 4 clinic sessions by working at the DOCS community health fairs; <u>one full day</u> at a health fair counts for 2 clinic sessions
- Supervise a team of 1st and 2nd year students in clinic
- Conduct Check Out Rounds at the end of each clinic night
- Complete a reflective evaluation of the clinic session that will also serve as a record of attendance
- Attend at least 5 didactic sessions, 1 of which must be the core EMR training session

Student Responsibilities

- 1. Attend Core Didactic session (EMR training)
- 2. Schedule \geq 9 clinic sessions by August 11th
- 3. Cancel clinics \geq 1 week before clinic session
- 4. Find student replacement if cancel \leq 1 week before clinic session
- 5. Supervise clinic team and conduct Check-Out Rounds
- Submit Reflective Experience Log < 1 week after clinic session
- 7. Attend ≥ 4 Elective Didactic sessions
