

Do you have an uninsured child?

Your child may be eligible for Florida's KidCare program.



What exactly is KidCare?

KidCare is a health insurance program offered by the state of Florida to cover uninsured children up through the age of 18. It is offered to uninsured children who are US citizens (and in some cases qualified non-citizens). It is broken up into 4 separate programs:

MediKids covers uninsured children up to age 4.

Healthy Kids covers uninsured children ages 5 through 18.

Children's Medical Services Network covers uninsured children with special health needs from birth through age 18.

Medicaid covers uninsured children who qualify up through age 18 and is free of charge.

What does KidCare cover?

KidCare covers a number of different services including:

doctor visits	vision & hearing	dental
prescriptions	check-ups & shots	surgery
emergencies	mental health	hospital stays

How much does KidCare cost?

KidCare Medicaid is free of charge. The other programs have a monthly premium cost that is based on the household size and income. Most families pay **\$15** per month. There may also be some small charges or co-pays for certain services.

How do I sign up for KidCare?
